

### Art

- Create an interesting collage of a Viking scene; stormy sea, long boat or raid.
- Design a piece of Viking jewellery.
- Draw a picture of a Viking god or goddess.
- Create your own shield design make sure the motif on the front represents something about you.

### Science

- Make a poster showing people how to be safe with electricity.
- Find out about Benjamin Franklin and his link to electricity.
- Research some other famous scientists who worked with electricity; such as Thomas Edison, Nicholas Tesla.

### History

- Research the city of York (Jorvik). What was it like in Viking times?
- Create a fact file of some of the key figures; Ragnar Lothbrok, King Cnut or Ethelred the Unready.

### R.E. / P.H.S.E.

- Create a poster showing what makes a good friend.
- Create a card for someone you care about in your family or friendship group, make sure you include what makes them special to you.
- Print off a photo of yourself and around the outside write what makes you special.
- Make a prayer card including the Lord's prayer. Share it with some of the people in your family.

### English

- Write a diary entry for someone living in an Anglo-Saxon town when the Vikings invaded.
- Write a non-chronological report about a Viking warrior.
- Read the text Viking Voyages and then answer the questions on Purple Mash

## The Vikings Year 4 Homework

### DI

- Design your own Viking emblem to scare your enemies.
- Come up with a menu for a Viking meal, research which foods were popular at the time.
- Create your own piece of Viking jewellery, you could use clay beads or pieces of pasta.
- Build a Viking long home.

### Geography

- Create a map of Britain showing the Anglo-Saxon Kingdoms and how they changed when the Vikings invaded.
- Identify places with a Viking origin on the map of Britain. Remember to look out for places with Thorpe, Thwaite, Toft, Keld, Ness, By, and kirk.
- Research the Viking homelands in Scandinavia what was it like? What is it like now?  
You could use 2graph in Purple Mash to show some of the key information.

For homework this term, you need to select 10 pieces that you would like to do to help you discover more about our theme and record each one using the table below. You need to select at least one activity from each subject box. Each piece of work that you produce must be of high quality, as they will be shared with your class. Be as creative as you can and have fun completing each activity, you might even like to do an activity as a whole family. Your class teacher will regularly check-in with you to find out how you are getting on with each project. Once you have completed a piece of work, remember to bring it into school or take a photo, so that your class teacher and class can see the fantastic work that you have produced. All 10 pieces must be completed and handed in by Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July. Please note, you do not have to stick to the activities suggested. If you have a better idea that links well to our theme and the subjects above, please feel free to do so. Additionally, if your child needs any support or resources, please ask their class teacher.

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
