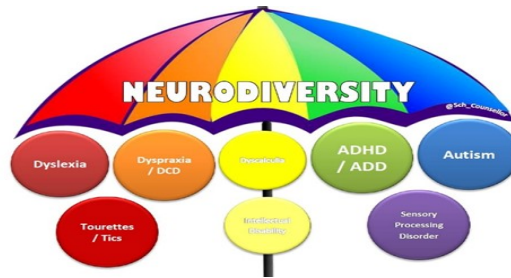
### Volunteer Parent Helpers

### Neurodiversity

We have been celebrating ‘Neurodiversity’ with the children, which celebrates our unique strengths and differences. The children have learnt that Neurodiversity is based on the idea that everyone has a differently-wired brain and their own unique way of thinking and experiencing the world. That means that everyone thinks, learns and processes information differently. Differences in the way our brains are wired means that you may struggle to do things that others find easy. You may also find things easy that other people struggle with. Some of the different ways of thinking, learning, interacting and perceiving the world have been given labels, such as:

- ☑ ADHD
  - ☑ Autism
  - ☑ Dyslexia
  - ☑ Dyspraxia
  - ☑ Tourette Syndrome
- The children will be learning more about what these terms mean in the coming weeks and months as part as the ‘**Neurodiversity Umbrella Project for Schools**’.

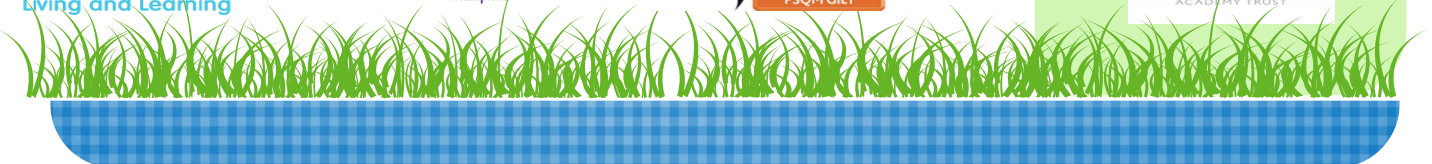


This project is an uplifting visual representation of all the different minds we have here in the UK. This will result in 25 colourful umbrellas being strung together in our school. This display is designed to represent the one in five of us who have a neurodevelopmental condition, such as ADHD, Autism, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia or Tourette’s syndrome. These conditions fall under the **umbrella** term of neurodiversity. We are changing the perception of neurodiverse/neurodivergent people and celebrating all the many strengths that come from thinking differently.

### Holiday Free School Meal Voucher Scheme

We would like to make you aware of some of the schemes that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families of Gloucestershire:

This Spring break, Gloucestershire County Council is providing vouchers to parents who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of its commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through COVID-19 grant funding we have received and is separate to that of the term time free school meals.

Unfortunately, we are unable to consider college and sixth form students.

Parents who have signed up to the scheme will receive a voucher for £30 for each child who is eligible for FSM which will cover both the two weeks of the Spring holiday. The scheme is eligible for children aged 4-16 years old. Unfortunately, we are unable to consider college and sixth form students.

Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register, they have already been included, but, to ensure we get all who are eligible, we are encouraging new parents to sign up as soon as they can.

For parents who have already signed up, if more of their children have become entitled to free school meals since they applied, please ask them to contact us so we can update their amount, as this not an automatic process.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers for the February half term period is now open until the 4<sup>th</sup> April. Voucher emails will be sent out between 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> April. Please encourage parents to also check their junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.
