Stroud District Council is working with Gloucestershire County Council in the Easter Holidays to deliver activities funded by the DFE through the Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF) 2021

As part of this rollout, Gloucestershire County Council can provide activities and nutritious food to children eligible for Free School Meal's during some of the school half-term periods. This will include provision for the upcoming Easter school holidays.

With funding from the DfE, and in partnership with local agencies, providers and communities an offer of activities that last at least 4 hours a day for 4 days a week, for 6 weeks of the year that include food and cook along videos in order to make a nutritious meal will be available to families where children are eligible for free school meals.

Due to the current restrictions imposed by the government, the HAF programme will be delivered mainly virtually for the Easter half-term period.

During the **first week of half-term**, they will provide on line activities to all children/families eligible for Free School Meals. These will include a daily cook-along video and tasks for them to engage with.

All activities will be suitable for children aged 5 to 16 and will be available on the HAF web page which can be accessed through the Gloucestershire County Council website.

Families will also be able to book and collect a Home Cooking Kit which contains recipe cards and enough food/ingredients for 4 meals and an Activities Pack with things to do for that week.

These will be available for pick up from a collection point in their local area. Parents need to complete an application form in order for them to allocate the Home Cooking Kits/Activity Packs.
