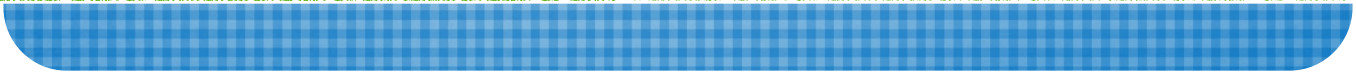
January 2023: The New Year First Week Back!

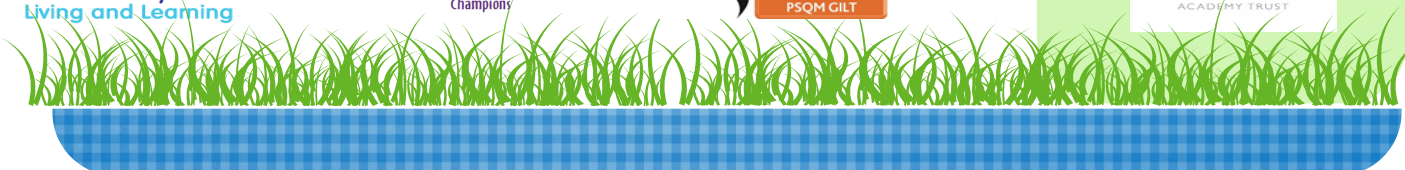
